







Ride Summary

This great 50 mile loop visits a popular area dubbed "Little Switzerland" by local cyclists. Located northwest of Fredericksburg, this Gillespie County region features several challenging climbs, quiet roads and terrific Hill Country scenery.

Traveling there, ride via one of Gillespie County's most popular cycling arteries: Crabapple Road. Cyclists appreciate its tranquility and scenic landscapes. The ride is not all pleasure along this stretch, however, because the *Fredericksburg Foothills* and *Mount Crabapple* lie in wait. The latter of these is an especially substantial climbing challenge.

The Little Switzerland region features gently rolling hills and several climbs—Welgehausen, Swiss Miss and L'Alpe Petite. These remote roads provide abundant rural tranquility, often keenly appreciated by city-based visitors.

Leaving Little Switzerland, the route turns abruptly upward in the first mile of Gypsum Mine Road. Continue climbing for four miles to the top of *Cherry Mountain* (it does not look like a peak, but the summit lies just before the route turns right on Cherry Mountain Loop).

From here drop down a bit and then enjoy small rolling hills on a sustained plateau along Wendel-Ahrens Road. Then begin the long net descent back to Fredericksburg (unfortunately, often against a prevailing southeasterly headwind).

Points of Interest

Crabapple Road

One of the best cycling roads in the county; the church and community center complex at its northern end makes a good place to pause for a break.

Little Switzerland

A scenic, hilly and remote area that we believe resembles the lands of the mountainous Swiss Federation (well, if you squint).

Gypsum Mine

Not much to look at, perhaps, but certainly a novelty. Cycling in this direction (southwest), the mine entrance lies at a point of mild gradient; riders still have a bit of easy climbing ahead.

Old Mason Road

The old road to Mason makes a favorable alternate to US HWY 87. Quiet, little traveled, pretty and, in this direction, almost entirely downhill.

Hills of Interest

Fredericksburg Foothills

(Cat. 3)—the ride starts with a sharp, steady climb at the outskirts of town; a great warmup.

Mt. Crabapple

(Cat 1)—a fiendish climb but the prevailing southeast wind should aid in the spring and summer. At the top, be sure to look back at the picturesque view of Gillespie County and the Pedernales River valley.

Welgehausen

(Cat 1)—this hill demarcates your entrance to "Little Switzerland"; ride it to see why. Have fun but be careful on the subsequent fast and twisting descent.

Swiss Miss

(Cat HC)—Flirt with her at your displeasure. She starts steep and, although the grade softens as you go, the crest eludes for a great distance.

L'Alpe Petite

(Cat 2)—This sustained climb presents little in the way of steep gradients. But its location in the ride —lurking after other climbing challenges—and its overall length both contribute to its notoriety.

Cherry Mountain

(Cat HC)—A very steep, straight grade greets cyclists as they begin riding along Gypsum Mine Road. The angle of attack then declines to a most-manageable degree, but know that the elevation continues to increase for several miles.




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Eat & Drink

This route offers virtually no commercial sustenance outside of the city of Fredericksburg. Fuel up before departing and carry ample hydration and energy resources. Distances between commercial establishments offering such may be vast. When cycling on hot days we recommend hydration packs for longer routes.

Start/Finish

This route begins and ends at the Fredericksburg, Texas Visitor Center. Find it at the corner of Austin Street and Lincoln Street, one block north of Main Street.

This departure location favors groups of gathering cyclists because it features off-street parking. When forming a group ride here, we recommend cyclists gather in the large parking lot located behind (north of) the Visitor Center (and Chamber of Commerce) office buildings. To minimize exposure to traffic, we discourage gathering in front of the facility on busy Austin Street.

Ride Friendly
